



And here's another pilgrim's tale...

A recent letter to *The Times* highlighted the renewed interest in pilgrimage. To quote: "More and more are showing an interest in walking and talking about their faith and doubts on one of the many new pilgrim routes that have opened in recent years'. Indeed, Ann Dunn in Colton has already shared with us her experience of walking to Santiago de Compostela and the joys she gained from that hugely demanding walk. My recent pilgrimage to Canterbury was not on the same scale and I had the luxury of a bed each night in a Canterbury boarding school and substantial meals cooked for us. But the spirit of pilgrimage was with our group of 11 ladies from the start. We began with a day immersed in the Christian history of Canterbury. In 597AD Augustine came to lead a new Christian mission on order of Pope Gregory.

He was welcomed by Queen
Bertha and used her chapel at what
is now St Martin's Church building
upon the Roman foundations,
extending the Christian heritage
right back to those early times.
King Ethelbert was baptised a
Christian in 600AD and thus began

the very foundations of Christianity in England. Augustine soon established a seat or 'cathedra' within the Roman walls – the remains of this original incarnation of the cathedral lie underneath its current nave. In Norman times the community of Canterbury Cathedral became a Benedictine monastery; a century later in 1170, the cathedral became the site of an infamous crime – the murder and martyrdom of Archbishop Thomas Becket. For me, the altar commemorating this awful event was one of the most moving scenes within the Cathedral, In 1982 Michael Ramsey the Archbishop of Canterbury knelt in silence with

Pope John Paul II praying for peace and reconciliation. The sculpture is of the three swords that killed Beckett shaped in such a way to reflect the crucifixion of Christ. And then we started our walking! There is an ominous stone at the cathedral indicating that Rome is 1800km away along the Via Francigenga, the ancient pilgrimage route. I have to confess we only walked the Kent part of this route! We walked in silence, we sang and we laughed but most of all we chatted about life, faith, experiences and deep questions of belief. As we entered open churches en route, we were welcomed by organists practising, who were keen to accompany our singing, or by the sheer joy

of silence.

The presence of God in stunning downland countryside, abundant apple orchards and coastal views was tangible.

We were at one with words spoken by the Iona community:

In a world vibrating with action We come here to be still.

In a world of tight schedules and deadlines

We have come to absorb the present.

In a world of limits and frustrations We have come to the brink of eternity.

At the still point of a churning world

We wait to meet the unchanging God and know his peace.


